2021 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING – MINUTES

HELD AT BEAUMARIS FOOTBALL CLUB TUESDAY 23RD NOVEMBER 2021

Meeting Opened : 7.05pm

Present: As per the Attendance record book

Welcome: Terry Lucas (President) opened the meeting, welcomed everyone and declared a quorum.

Apologies: Stephen Nash, Craig Rawlings, David Hickey, Greg Diamond, Matt Petering, Ellen Wood

Minutes of 2020 meeting: The minutes from the 2020 meeting were adopted.

Proposed – Mark Francis Seconded – Ben Conrad

Issues arising from 2020 minutes: TL – NIL

It was mentioned that Roger Hunt, member of 1963 side passed away. TL highlighted that we want to embrace and promote the love and history of our club and involve past players as much as possible in 2022.

Correspondence: Nil

Presidents Report: TL noted that the Annual Report was provided online and that there were hard copies available at the front of the room – TL said that he would “take the President’s Report as read” but did want to mention a few things before taking questions.

The season stopped in July hurt the club significantly. We could have increased revenue substantially if we weren’t shut down. With the help of the juniors, we have at least achieved a break even result in a tough season.

Lewis Diggins won VAFA B Grade B & F, Senior women Caley, Zoe and Hayley were named in the women’s VAFA best team

We had very good player numbers and a record 7 teams including 2 snr women's teams. Player retention and recruiting will continue to be a focus.

We purchased reversible jumpers for all teams.

Our major sponsor ASKIN renewed its sponsorship.

We had set ourselves to have a great year on and off the field – there was of course nothing we could do about COVID and now we look at how we move forward into 2022.

We have a COVID policy for players in place. Still a personal choice as to whether you want to be vaccinated.

All in all TL was very proud of our footy club.

60 years next year which we plan to celebrate. We have a junior program that is the envy of everyone and our seniors do well given we have no schools feeding us players. Retaining 19s and senior players is always difficult and the attraction of cash to another club is always tempting to them. We will keep working on making BFC a destination club.

We have one big fund raising event still to come - the Xmas raffle – the juniors are supporting it strongly – we aim to raise \$30K- \$35k – that will not be included in the 2021 financials but will greatly assist season 2022. Askin have already given us next year's sponsorship money to help with cash flow.

Treasurer's Report: presented by Paul Davis

2021 accounts have been slightly amended as part of the audit process to reflect aggregation of Junior and Senior revenue of the BFC. As they exceeded the income level an audit was required. COVID grants from Gov't and council have been highlighted.

The auditor has completed his review and his report will be attached to the financial statements that Paul and Terry have signed. While the result was lower than previous years, it was still a good outcome considering the 2021 COVID environment. Sponsor support has been good, especially the long term sponsors.

TL commented on sponsorship – RE took over sponsorship management in 2018 and lifted it to 100K . That was significant. TL now running sponsorship with PC and GD – we raised approx. \$120k this year which assists with our football department costs which are significant.

PD mentioned the bar and canteen – we managed to lease out the canteen and any income goes to a future fund to recover maintenance costs of the building.

PD explained that some expenses had gone up from previous years – his report provided explanations.

PD thanked Darren Trew for all his help – Darren is the Treasurer of the Juniors.

TL seconded PD's comments on Darren Trew's efforts

There were no questions.

Report accepted. Proposed – Ian Millar Seconded – Fiona Love

Coaches Report

TL – we will take the senior coach's report as being read. TL outlined coaching changes in 2022. TL noted that we wanted to keep as many Beaumaris people here as possible even on a part time basis. Eg Josh Bourke who had accepted a role at St Kevin's year 12 side.

Peter Caswell questioned – what is the definition of Craig and Dann's role in the women's team– TL said they were assistant coaches but would leave it to the head Coach, Brian Royal and Nick Heath to sort out.

Senior Captains' Reports

TL – take snr men's captains report as read – Matt Petering will play again but will not be Captain. TL highlighted how sensational Matt had been for the club.

TL mentioned that Ellen Wood was a fantastic person who had done the ACL in her knee twice but still contributed a committee person of field.

The women's report was taken as read

A few things were highlighted - in particular the report raised a few challenges from the women's perspective – women still feel a bit on inequality, especially if they can't play at Oak St. If that

was to continue, then any alternative venues need to be the same quality as Oak st.

TL thanked Ellen for the strength and character to report this and wanted it noted for follow up in 2022.

TL – before I hand over to Nicki I want to say Nicki has been amazing for our club – she’s been Team Manager, Secretary, Junior President and a multitude of other things and has now retired from Junior land. She is dedicated and passionate and has a history with footy with her dad. She is outstanding. TL asked for a round of applause.

Junior Presidents Report:

NS – Juniors played 9 rounds of football and was fortunate to do so..

At the SMJFL AGM at the beginning of season the Clubs had a robust discussion around fees and pushed for a reduction – the SMJFL eventually relented and provided a 4-team discount and bore the cost of insurance. This was a good result for the clubs.

The SMJFL are currently pushing for changes at the AGM to the by-laws and their statement of rules which will have a detrimental effect on Clubs, by effectively placing the balance of power in the hands of the league and Board, and away from Clubs. Nicki’s strong recommendation to the 2022 committee would be to vote against the proposed changes.

Nicki reported strong numbers in 12 14 and 16 girls and noted that over the passage of time skills have improved and will keep improving. A review of the junior girls program was conducted in the 2021 that will lead to an increased focus on skills

In the main the Club was competitive but there were some areas where fixturing and grading was not appropriate.

Nicki noted there could be an issue fielding an Under 15 team in 2022 if we can’t retain our U14 boys. She encouraged the 2022 junior committee to put some focus on that.

In 2021 we were able to hold a couple of Shark of the months but hopefully 2022 will be different.

Congratulations to the two junior boys who were picked up in the mid-season draft– Jacob Edwards and Max Heath.

The BFC Juniors however did conduct their own B & F and Nicki said “well done to all winners and participants”

We had a number of boys participate in the U17s Dragons squad, and a number of boys and girls participate in the interleague competition which was able to be conducted between lockdowns.

The Numbers in the U14 boy age group is an issue as noted in my report. (Matter to follow up)

Beaumaris had a large number of players awarded golden boots for their 10 years of footy, which is testament to the clubs ability to retain players through to the Under 17 age group.

Nicki gave specific thanks to Peter Caswell and Pauline who provided assistance during the year.

The Juniors made a decision to offer refunds to families for the incomplete season in 3 ways – A refund in full of the \$50, \$50 raffle ticket or donate to the club. – this was a great result for all and well received

Nicki gave thanks to Ben, Darren, Stephen, Christine, Carlie, Fi, (all junior committee). Nicki also recognized Tim Holt for his contribution and who was awarded SMJFL Volunteer of the Year.

Nicki also mentioned Damien, Lee and Christine – who finish up on the committee, and extends “a massive thank you” on behalf of the whole club for their time and effort.

Nicki gave thanks to Terry for his personal support and the senior committee for their ongoing support of the junior program.

Nicki acknowledged Stacy Lolas (Auskick Co-Ordinator) - “who is truly amazing – she is outstanding” . Nicki highlighted that Stacey had set up the disability football program, within our Auskick program, which is outstanding.

Nicki noted that Ben Conrad was taking on the Junior President role with Jack Dyer as his Vice President, and wished them both well.

Nicki concluded with the following comment: “I’ve really enjoyed my time – I could write a book”!!

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2022

Bring on 2023!! I am already very excited about season 2023 for the Beaumaris Sharks. While I will be stepping down as President at the 2022 AGM, I know that we have laid strong foundations both on and off the field, and that the 2023 off field leadership team, as well as the coaches and players, are already working hard to make next year even better.

As I reflect on my five years as President, I'd like to repeat something I've said many times before: "I feel privileged and honored to be part of this great club, borne out of the commitment and selflessness of our returning service men and women, driven by dedicated and passionate people (both players and supporters) for 60 years, and now providing a game of football and a wonderful club environment for almost 1,000 players. **It's a special place, the Beaumaris Football Club.** 35 junior teams and potentially 7+ senior teams for season 2023".

I'm lucky enough to be involved with the seniors and also a junior coach. There are so many great people in our club, both players and supporters. While we love to win finals, the fact that so many men and women, boys and girls, got a chance to play for our club or be involved with our club is a wonderful achievement in itself.

On field there were a number of achievements we can be proud of in season 2022. One of my biggest highlights was the inaugural senior women's flag!!! (and of course the Under 13's flag!). 6 years in the making, Dazza Behrendorff and his mighty women's team delivered the chocolates in emphatic, undefeated style. It was a great thrill for so many of us. Our senior men had a great home and away season as did our under 19s. Our thirds had a brilliant year after not winning a game in 2021. They finished on top and lost the preliminary final in extra time. Meanwhile our Juggernaut Juniors had an amazing year, with 8 teams winning Premierships.

Personally, I've loved my 5 years as President. It hasn't been without its difficulties, given the BSC situation, the drawn-out negotiations to get a lease in our name, the fight to get memorabilia and photos on the walls and control of our rooms, dealing with Covid shutdowns and a Balance Sheet that was hurting given all the above. I'm delighted that through the hard work of so many, Our Club is in a strong position on and off the field.

The seniors made a cash surplus of approximately \$30,000 in 2022. The Juniors continue to thrive. We have secured a long-term lease and the culture and vibe on and off the field has been applauded by many. I feel heartened by that and look forward to things continually improving every year from now. ***Once a Shark, Always a Shark: it's the place to be!!***

In total, we gave nearly 1000 kids and young adults the chance to play footy. It's a huge number and one the entire community should be proud of. We also had the support of 2,000+ parents and supporters and life members. We are **ONE CLUB**. We are a **GREAT CLUB**.

We now look forward with much positivity to season 2023. I've listed below some things we can be grateful for from season 2022 and some things to get excited about for season 2023: -

- 2023 is the year in which we will celebrate 60 years of footy at the Beaumaris Sharks. The club was formed in 1963. There are still a number of people from that time active at the club. I can't wait to celebrate them and the club's achievements over 6 decades. It's going to be a special year on and off the field. Two words for you all: **GET INVOLVED!!**
- We have a new look coaching group, with Josh Bourke accepting the senior men's coach position. Josh has appointed three highly credentialed assistants in Mick Lovejoy, Nick Moodie and Stephen Milne. All four have already had a significant impact in terms of vibe, retention and recruitment. Steve Scott, a humble and dedicated Shark, has been appointed reserves coach. It was a very well received appointment. Justin Wilson's promotion to Under 19s Head Coach was also very welcome news. I have written about all the new coaches in the various club announcements that have been made (see club website news). We are delighted to have all these men on board. I have no doubt they will make us a better club on and off the field.
- Pre-season training for the senior women began on Tuesday 15 November and for the senior men on Thursday 17 November. There were very good numbers. Our player retention is excellent, with so many Sharks already committing to 2023. Our new senior men's coach, Josh Bourke, has been very active in the recruiting space, with at least 10 new faces coming to the Sharks for season 2023.
- An "all club effort" enabled the seniors to have their strongest financial season in many years, returning to a cash profit for the first time since pre BSC days. The seniors finished the year with almost \$30,000 cash in the bank as well as stock of club jackets, club shorts and new playing jumpers. Corporate sponsors, player sponsors, committee, players and supporters all played their role. The December 2021 raffle and the 2022 reverse draw were also fund-raising highlights. A special thank you to Liam O'Donnell who generously donated his reverse draw winnings back to the club.
- After securing the lease for our upstairs clubrooms in 2021, we were able to have a full season of functions in 2022. We were able to host dinners, players nights, events and other functions. Players and members and supporters loved having their clubrooms back. A special mention to Nicki Spencer and her team of merry women who brought Thursday night player dinners back with a bang. Some of the highlight events included the Ron Nicholson run functions (Anzac Day, 2010 Premiership Reunion, Past Players Day, 100 Game and Life Members Dinner – well done Ron), the Reverse Draw raffle (thank you Greg Diamond), the junior Dads lunches (well done Dave Hickey and Ben Conrad), the sponsors night and the 2022 Best and Fairest.

Steve Caffyn Best Club Person Award 2022 – Joint Winners Bill Linehan and Peter Caswell

“Steve Caffyn first played in the Under 17’s in ‘64/’65. Ronny Nicholson was in the same team. He also played a bit of Reserves footy but was involved with a band as lead singer and then worked in hospitality. So he gave up playing but offered to help out in other ways. He had many friends at the club and loved the place.

He was on the committee, specialising in social functions, and also helped with team managing. When his good mate, Mick Kirkby, started coaching in the Juniors Steve always helped him as team manager/assistant coach. Very popular around the club and area with a happy-go-lucky nature and his music. Every Beamaris function ended with Steve’s version of G-L-O-R-I-A ‘Gloria’.

Then all of a sudden he was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease (hereditary) and steadily declined. He kept working around the club but then became frail and ended up in a wheelchair. There was a Sunday afternoon send-off for him in the old rooms that was packed with footy people as well as many others. The whole room cheered (and cried) when he was helped on stage to belt out his signature song, G-L-O-R-I-A, for the last time.

After he died from MND the BFC named the Best Club Person Award in his name”.

To win the Steve Caffyn Best Club Person Award is one of the highest honours in the Club. In 2022 I was delighted to present the award to joint winners, **Bill Linehan and Peter Caswell**. Both humble men who love the club. They would do anything for the players and the club. Linnars has the tough role of senior men’s team manager and has done an amazing job. He has also taken many photos. Cas is a man that I admire greatly and he has been enormous for me over my 5 years. I will be forever grateful for him going above and beyond to make sure that our entire club gets an abundance of news, events, flyers, stories and photos on a consistent basis. Treasurers Report – Year Ended 30 September 2022

The financial statements for the 30 September 2022 financial year, have been prepared on an aggregated basis combining the operating results of both the senior and junior sections of the Beaumaris Football Club (BFC).

As the Club's turnover exceeds the threshold of a 'tier 2 entity' under the Corporations Act Victoria the Club is required to have its financial statements reviewed by an independent auditor.

Operating Result Summary

The Club generated a very strong operating profit of \$81,872 for 2022 as against \$2,540 in 2021. The result reflects the continued exceptional support of corporate and player sponsors, club supporters, the broader community and hard work of the Committees and all the many volunteers that have given their time and expertise to enable the Club to function. An analysis of the main income and expense items for the year and commentary thereon is set out below:

BFC – Juniors 2022 Annual Report

As we close out Season 2022, it is an opportune time to reflect on what a season it was. We had many highlights and most encouragingly we provided kids an opportunity to play the game they love every Sunday wearing the Sharks colors.

Season 2022 began with our traditional sausage sizzle and family night which was well received and well attended. The weather was kind to us and it was great to see so many local kids enjoy the festive atmosphere. The vibe was fantastic and upbeat. We cooked over 400 sausages this evening, which was greatly appreciated by the kids and families and this was our way of giving back to the community.

This season we fielded 35 teams, across all age groups from Under 8 to Under 18 Girls. We had boy's teams in all age groups of the mixed comp and girl's teams across Under 10, 12, 13, 14, 16 and 18's. This year saw the introduction of an U13s girls team for the first time as offered by the League. Our overall numbers were only slightly down and we fielded the same number of teams as 2021. This was a pleasing result given the drop off in numbers at League level i.e. approximately 5% from 2021. After two very challenging years preceding this season, the drop off in numbers was not a surprise and we hope to build on this year's numbers for season 2023.

We measure success in the juniors by the competitiveness of our teams. Each year we spend a considerable amount of time considering the placement of our teams within divisions that best suit the makeup of that team, to ensure that each game participated in is played competitively, allowing all of our players to develop to the best of their ability. We achieved this in the main. The League introduced a new grading policy structure this year which I believe was an improvement of previous seasons and we were pleased, on an overall basis, with where our teams were placed.

The byproduct of placing teams in the most competitive divisions, is that it best positions the teams for finals. Of those teams eligible to compete in finals we had 18 of 25 eligible teams play finals represented by mixed and girl's teams in the following age groups: Under 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17 and Under 18 age groups. Of the 18 teams who played finals, 11 teams made grand finals with 8 teams successful and 3 runners up.

Congratulations to the Under 12 Girls Div 3, Under 13 Div 1, Under 13 Div 4, Under 15 Div 4, Under 16 Div 1, Under 16 Div 3, Under 17.5 Div 1 and Under 18 Div 2 girls, who were successful. Well done also to the Under 14 Div 4 boys and U16 Div 1 and Div 3 Girls who were gallant in defeat.

We have rewritten the history books with 8 Premierships this season. This is a magnificent result and comes about off the back of many years of investment in an A grade football program established over many years.

This year also saw the introduction of an inaugural Director of Coaching appointment for our Girls program which is headed up by Gary Nicholls. Gary has worked tirelessly this year to improve the overall skill development of the girls and this appears to have borne fruit this year with 2 premierships from 4 grand

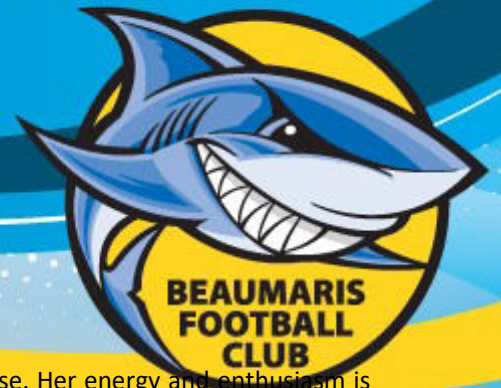

Notes to the Financial Statements – Year Ended 30 September 2022

1 Summary of accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical cost. The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the requirements of the financial reporting requirements under the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria. In the opinion of the management committee, the Beaumaris Football Club (BFC) is not a reporting entity because there are no users dependent on general purpose financial statements.

Accounting policies

The accounting policies adopted by the Club are stated in order to assist in a general understanding of the financial statements. These policies have been consistently applied except as otherwise indicated.

Change in Operations and Points to Note

Other Income

The Club applied for and was successful in receiving a wage subsidy grant for \$2,947 from SYC Ltd and a grant from Open Spaces for \$2,273.

Merchandise Costs

Included within the merchandise costs are costs associated with purchasing trainer's tops, polos and jackets provided to coaches/team managers and bibs for officials etc. Where possible these costs are subsidised through sponsorship, with associated income recognised within Corporate Sponsorship income.

2 Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Subscription income is shown net of direct expenses comprising (1) medical and insurance expenses (\$24,702: 2021 \$17,030), (2) player equipment and bag costs (\$18,685: 2021 \$2,250) and (3) coaching coordinator and coaching costs (\$36,719: 2021 \$30,782). This income received by the Junior section of the Club is treated as a sub-entity of the Club for GST purposes.



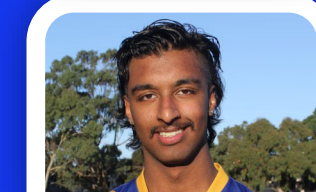

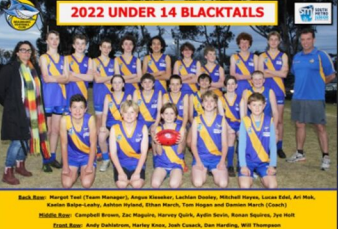
